There will be no premiums or prize monies awarded except in Youth Showmanship. Rosettes will be awarded for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion in each division and Champion Challenge/Best in Breed.

The order of the show IS subject to change at the discretion of the show committee.

Animals without papers may not be shown. Junior and Senior Bucks will be sanctioned together. The Junior and Senior Doe shows are separately sanctioned.

The following breeds are sanctioned by American Dairy Goat Association (ADGA) and will be shown as listed: Nigerian Dwarf. The Junior and Senior Does shows are separately sanctioned. ADGA Rules shall govern.

Directions:

From I75 take exit 301 and go east on SR 50. Approximately 1.2 miles, at the second traffic light, turn left onto Croom Rital Rd. Proceed 1.5 miles, the entrance for the show grounds will be on your right set back from Croom Rital Rd. You will pass over the paved Withlacoochee State Trail, do no turn on the trail.

From US 301 go west on SR 50. Approximately 3.5 miles, turn right onto Croom Rital Rd. Proceed 1.5 miles, the entrance for the show grounds will be on your right set back from Croom Rital Rd. You will pass over the paved Withlacoochee State Trail, do no turn on the trail.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE 2026 March Mini Madness Show

<u>ENTRIES</u>: Entries will be accepted up to 3/1/26 midnight. Entry fee is \$10 per animal for NDGCF members, \$15 per animal for non-members for entries received by Monday, March 1st, 2026. Entries received after March 1st will be \$15 per entry for NDGCF Members and \$20 per entry for non-members. (Remember one entry is for 2 rings.)

All entries will be done through www.showman.app.

Substitutions will be accepted upon arrival. All substitutions will be done at early check in and check in time from 4:00 pm - 6:00 pm 3/6/26 or 7:00 am - 8:30 am 3/7/26

Exhibitor may provide their own pens or pens under the pavilion can be rented for \$10 each for March 6th - 7th only. You must bring your own shavings, pens are on concrete. No straw or hay for bedding. You must clean up any trash around your pen or parking area. Stalls do need to be cleaned before you leave - all shavings.

The official registration certificate is required for all animals 6 mos. of age or older. A Stamped Duplicate for registration stamped by the ADGA office is permissible for animals under 6 months of age.

The registration or stamped duplicate application must be available to the show secretary at the time of arrival. All animals must be naturally polled, dehorned or dis-budded.

Vendor space available for \$30 (or an equivalent item for the raffle table). See Vendor Registration Form.

SHOWMANSHIP: Judging will be based on the ADGA Showmanship Scorecard. Premiums will be awarded. Rosettes and ribbons will be awarded. Winner's certificates available thru ADGA. See www.adga.org for more information on the Showmanship requirements. All youth exhibitors will be required to be clean and neat and dressed in white or black jeans or slacks with a solid white shirt with a white collar. Youth may wear 4H or FFA attire. No caps or hats. Closed-toed shoes or boots are required. Exhibitors not conforming to the Dress Code will not be allowed to enter the Show Ring. Showmanship entries are free. Exhibitors must show a dairy goat officially entered in the open show. Showmanship entry must be filled out and given at check in (separate from open entry).

SHOWMANSHIP JUDGING:

- 1. Judging will be based on the ADGAShowmanship Scorecard
- 2. Ability to show a Dairy Goat.
- 3. Grooming and cleanliness of goat.
- 4. Ability to answer any questions asked by the Judge.
- 5. Knowledge of parts of the goat.
- 6. Neatness and appropriate attire in the show ring.
- 7. Exhibitors must adhere to the attire guidelines.

HEALTH RULES - NEW for 2026

All animals will be inspected by a Show Committee person prior to entering the show grounds. Health papers are NOT required for Florida exhibitors where the animals have been in Florida prior to the show..

Goats coming into Florida must have an OCVI dated not more than 30 days prior. All imported dairy goats 6 months of age or older must originate from a certified/accredited herd (with appropriate documentation), or have verifiable, documented negative testing results recorded on the OCVI.

All animals must be free from clinical symptoms of caseous lymphadenitis. Animals showing clinical symptoms of this disease will not be allowed to enter the area of activity or to become associated with animals entered by other participants. With reference to CL, clinical symptoms is the term used to define enlargements of the lymph nodes, whether draining or not. Evidence of incised lymph nodes will be interpreted as prima facia evidence of CL in the animal under scrutiny.

All animals must be free of all contagious diseases.

If goats are shaved at the show, all hair must be picked up and taken with your or put in trash!

OPEN SHOW ATTIRE

- *Dress is casual. Closed toed shoes or boots are required. No short shorts or tank tops.
- *Exhibitors not conforming to dress code will not be allowed to enter the ring. Show t-shirts purchased can be worn in the ring.


RELEASE

- *Animals are released upon completion of their classes.
- *CLEAN UP all trash around pens or vehicles before you leave.

NO DOGS ALLOWED AT SHOW - the only exception is a Service Animal. Emotional Support animals do not qualify as a service animal. Questions that will be asked are:

- * Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability?
- * What work or task has the dog been trained to preform?




